You can use light to communicate information. In the activity, Secret Signals, you can work iwith a partner to build a device that solves the problem of communicating over a distance.

Coloured pens – ideally red, blue and green. Don't use colours that are similar as it may be confusing. 2 torches (hint: ask your grown up for their phone!)

You will need to do this activity in the dark with the lights off and curtains drawn.

experiment to understand how bullying affects people but let's go one step further... The Bible tells us that a person speaks the things that are in their

Cardan Grille code

The Cardan Grille was first used to disguise a secret message by Renaissance mathematician Gerolamo Cardano (Italy) in 1550. The technique is used to hide a message in an ordinary looking document. The message would then be read later by someone who also had a copy of the same Grille - which would always be sent to them separately.

HAVE A GO!

Work with a partner!

- 1. The writer of the message places a piece of card with small irregular slots cut into it - a Cardan Grille. Both you and your partner will need to use the Grille.
- 2. Place your Grille over a sheet of plain paper
- 3. Write your message in the slots.
- 4. Remove the Grille and write sentences around your words. Thereby creating an apparently ordinary looking message.
- Your message can now be read by your partner using the Grille. 5. Creating the first message is easy... can you use the same Grille to send another coded message? Please email us a picture of your handiwork!
