ames had just finished watching the world cup match and he was thinking about all those famous players he saw on TV. He wished that he could be amazing at football like them because they made so much money and were so valuable to their clubs. He even heard that one of them was worth 300 million pounds! So, he asked his dad.

"Why can't I be like those guys? Some of my friends in school are even on the swimming team and they are so good at it. Another girl in my class does gymnastics and she's won national competitions, but I don't really feel important because I'm not popular or the best at anything."

His dad replied, "Well, there is a story in the Bible about four young people: Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah, who were taken from their hometown of Jerusalem to Babylon as slaves. The king (Nebuchadnezzar) ordered that they should be given the same food and drink that he ate but they had the boldness to



refuse it.

They even challenged their supervisor to test them on water and vegetables only for ten days to see if their appearances became worse. After the ten days, Daniel and his friends looked healthier than all the other men who ate the king's food." (Daniel 1:1-16) These young Hebrews were aware of who they were in God and therefore didn't want to be contaminated with food that had been offered to idols. They had a sense of self-worth which means that they knew they were children of God and deserve to be respected by others. This didn't mean they were arrogant or proud, but they were confident.

Matthew 10:31 says, 'So don't worry! You are more valuable to him than many sparrows.' How to develop a sense of self-worth:

• Know that God made you very good and unique. "God looked at everything he had made. And he saw that everything was very good. ..." (Genesis 1:31a - ERV). God says you are very good because everything He made is very good.

 \cdot Make Jesus your Saviour and Lord. If you wish to receive Jesus as your Saviour and Lord, say a simple prayer and invite Him to live in your heart.

When the men got to the land, they saw it was beautiful and good. But the people who were living there were large and super strong. When the spies returned to Moses and the rest of the Israelites, they told them about all they had seen. "The people living in that land are like giants! We look like tiny ants compared to them! They'll destroy us!"

But Joshua and Caleb both trusted and knew that God would help them to take the promised land from the Canaanites who lived there, but everyone else was afraid and scared to do what God had commanded.

Joshua and Caleb reminded the people about how God had helped them in the past, but they were still afraid.

God was angry because the Israelites refused to trust in Him. So, he told Moses that no one would be allowed to go into the promised land for forty years. However, someday He would take their children into the promised land when all the adults had grown old and died.

Forty years passed, Moses had died, and Joshua as the new leader of Israel, took all the grown children of those who had disobeyed forty years earlier, into the promised land. Caleb was now eighty years old, still strong and because

of his courage and faith, he conquered a whole city, and it became his property in the promised land.

God wants us to understand who we are in Christ, since we belong in His family, He wants us to learn about Him and do things to please Him. Like Joshua and Caleb, we should trust that we are able and can do all things through Christ and He will give us the strength and power to be successful.
