- Q: What does the above point tells us about obedience?
- 12. Until you travel you are limited by your background Genesis 41: 39-41
- Q: What does the above point tells us about trusting God?
- 13. Elijah the Tishbite had to break away from his local problems (Tishbe as a word means "captivity")

- 14. Elijah the Tishbite had to move to discover the diamond in him **Deuteronomy 29:29**
- 15. God delights in hiding miracles in obscure places with His mighty missiles stored in unexpected places) **Proverbs 25:2**
- **Q:** How do you find God' hidden jewels?
- 16. You come from a town that is not on the map, but if you travel with God you will be put on the map. **Genesis 12:1-2 (NKJV)**
- 17. It was travelling that made Jesus go through Gethsemane in order to get us out of hell **1 Peter 3:18:20**
- 18. Travelling may mean to get out of the limelight and be in the place of the refiner's fire
- Q: Give practical examples of when we might have to get out of the limelight
- 19. It may mean leaving the people you know and hang out with 2 Corinthians 6:17-18
- **Q:** Why is it necessary to leave those you know and hang out with?
- 20. Travelling may mean departing from God mockers **Psalms 1:1-2 (KJV**)
- 21. It may mean breaking free from those who entice you to the sin you had repented of James 4:4 (KJV)
- Q: At what point do you break free from such people?
