

**TOPIC: MAKING IMPACT**  
**THEME: PREVAILING IN MAKING IMPACT II**  
**TEXT: 1 KINGS 17:14-16, ROMANS 8:35-39, PHILLIPIANS 4:11-13**

### **Introduction**

As we conclude our series study on making maximum impact we will be exploring the second part on the subject of **Prevailing** after a period of **Travelling** and **Travailing**.

Prevailing is to gain ascendancy through strength or superiority: triumph. To be or become effective; to use persuasion successfully.

In the Bible, to prevail, means to prove superior in power and influence. It means to dominate in prevailing power.

### **Prevailing with Supernatural Provision**

**13.** All you need to make your vision happen is coming your way – **Philippians 4:19, 2 Corinthians 9:8**

**Q:** What should our attitude be if you know precisely what the outcome of you prevailing is going to be?

**14.** You have tried to make your own blessing with your skills but it didn't work – God has a commanded blessing for you – **Psalm 125:1, 2 Chronicles 16:7-9**

**15.** Supernatural resurrection, you will not die until you prevail – **Numbers 23:19**

**Q:** What is the relationship between the fulfilment of your purpose and what you go through?

**16.** You will not die until the commanded word becomes the fulfilled word. You will not **be allowed** to die until the Word prevails – **Acts 19:20, Isaiah 55:11 (NLT)**

**17.** It is your day of prevailing, God has seen you and understands you – **Romans 8:30 (NLT)**

**18.** He will reach out and help you from the dunghill to “the palace” – He will take you to the levels you have never been – **1 Samuel 2:8-9 (NLT)**

**Q:** Give other examples of bible characters with similar experience as above

**Examples of those who moved through the process of Travelling → Travailing → Prevailing to make Maximum Impact**

**19.** When Elijah moved from Tishbe, he made maximum impact – **1 Kings 17:1-10**

**20.** When Ruth moved from the familiar to the prophetic – she made maximum impact – **Ruth 1:15-17**

**21.** Abraham obeyed a command to move – he went from travelling to prevailing – **Genesis 12:1-3**

## **CONCLUSION**

I can do means I can prevail! How can we learn to prevail in life no matter what circumstances we are facing? A foundational key is to realize that we need God's help, His power and strength. This is what allows us to prevail, to prove superior! Another way of looking at "I can do" is by this confession, "I am ready for anything and equal to anything *through Him who infuses inner strength into me*" {Amplified Bible}. This is a prevailing attitude that we can develop in our lives. God's Word can teach anyone how to develop this prevailing attitude in life!
