## **INTRODUCTION**

**5.** Salvation is Not by Works — Ephesians 2:8-9 Salvation is NOT partly what God does and partly what you do. It's entirely of God, and all we've got to do is simply thank Him. It's a total letting go. A total surrender.

**6.** Striving to be like Jesus — Romans 8:17

As a Christian, we often see ourselves as sinners struggling every day to be more like Jesus. To have an identity in Christ means that we are defined by our relationship with Jesus Christ. We are no longer defined by our sins or our past. Instead, we are now children of God and joint heirs with Christ.
