INTRODUCTION

Wealth is not a measure of worth, but a responsibility from God. This week focuses on aligning our hearts, habits, and resources with God's Kingdom order. We are having a summary of our understanding of stewardship, faithfulness, tithing, and seed-sowing as Kingdom financial principles. Our summary review in this study, will help us to

- Understand our role as a steward, not an owner.
- Recognize faithfulness as the pathway to increase.
- Understand the purpose of tithing.
- Apply seed-sowing as a Kingdom principle.

THE CORE TRUTH ON STEWARDSHIP, FAITHFULNESS & KINGDOM FINANCE FOUNDATIONS

- Ownership belongs to God; stewardship belongs to us
- Faithfulness precedes increase
- Tithing recognizes God's authority, not ours
- Giving is not loss—it is an investment into Kingdom return

KEY TEACHING ON STEWARDSHIP, FAITHFULNESS & KINGDOM FINANCE FOUNDATIONS

1. God Owns All – You Are a Steward

- Everything begins and ends with God's ownership
- Stewardship requires accountability and obedience

Key Scriptures: Psalm 24:1, 1 Corinthians 4:2, Matthew 25:14–30 (Parable of the Stewards)

2. The Law of Faithfulness – Foundation of Increase

- Increase follows proven faithfulness
- God tests stewardship before entrusting more

Key Scriptures: Luke 16:10–12, Proverbs 28:20

3. The Tithe – God's Owned Portion

- Tithing honours God first, not leftovers
- It establishes divine order and protection

Key Scriptures: Malachi 3:8–10, Proverbs 3:9–10, Matthew 23:23 (principle of obedience)

4. The Power of Seed-Sowing

Giving is a seed that produces a harvest in God's timing

Multiplication follows divine laws, not emotion

Key Scriptures: 2 Corinthians 9:6–8, Genesis 8:22, Luke 6:38

CASE STUDY – The Faithful Steward A believer with limited income commits to tithing and consistent giving. Over time, financial opportunities, wisdom, and favour increase—not overnight, but steadily—demonstrating that obedience activates divine alignment, not instant wealth.
